TRUSTEE HONORARIUM

POLICY STATEMENT

Whereas the Board is accountable to our communities and to the Province for continuous improvement in student achievement;

Whereas the Board is fiscally responsible for spending public funds in a cost-effective and appropriate manner;

Whereas the Board is legally accountable to the public for the operation of our Catholic school system;

Whereas the Board sets local policy and plans with consideration to the needs and priorities of the system through a consultation process;

Whereas the Board is responsible for ensuring that our schools have the appropriate professional capacity and resources to meet provincial and Board policies and priorities; Whereas members of the Board act as education advocates at the local and provincial levels:

Whereas members of the Board act as stewards and guardians of Catholic education; Whereas members of the Board dedicate countless hours each month attending meetings of the Board and committee meetings in the interest of fulfilling their responsibilities; and Whereas the government of Ontario has provided a process to determine the level of trustee honorarium:

Be it resolved that the Board provide an honorarium to all trustees according to the regulations outlined in this policy and in accordance with provincial legislation.

POLICY REGULATIONS

- 1. Effective December 1, 2010, Board members shall receive honoraria for each year of the term of office equivalent to:
 - 1.1 a base amount of \$5,900; and
 - 1.2 100% of the enrolment amount limit determined using the calculation for a member other than the chair or vice-chair as outlined in Ontario Regulation 357/06 *Honoraria for Board Members*.
- 2. Effective December 1, 2010, a trustee who attends a meeting of a committee of the Board that is required to be established by an Act or a regulation made under the Act, namely SEAC and SALEP, shall receive an allocation of \$50 per meeting.

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3. Effective December 1, 2010, a trustee shall receive a distance amount allocation of \$50 per board meeting if the distance between the member's residence and the place where the meeting is held is more than 200 kilometres. A Board member may receive this allocation only once in respect of any day.

- 4. The Chair of the Board shall receive an additional allocation equivalent to:
 - 4.1 an additional base amount of \$5,000; and
 - 4.2 100% of the enrolment amount limit determined using the calculation for a chair as outlined in Ontario Regulation 357/06 Honoraria for Board Members.
- 5. The Vice Chair of the Board shall receive an additional allocation equivalent to:
 - 5.1 an additional base amount of \$2,500; and
 - 5.2 100% of the enrolment amount limit determined using the calculation for a Vice Chair as outlined in Ontario Regulation 357/06 Honoraria for Board Members.
- 6. In respect to the period from September 1, 2010 to November 30, 2010, the Board shall provide to a member or a former member of the Board an honorarium in the amount of \$6,406 for a twelve-month period, to be prorated for the three-month period.
- 7. Board members who serve for a partial year shall receive a prorated allocation as per Ontario Regulation 357/06 *Honoraria for Board Members*.
- 8. The Board may at any time change this policy such that a component is not paid for a year, the amount of a component to be paid is lowered for a year, or the percentage of the average daily enrolment limit to be paid is lowered for a year. The Board may restore the original policy and amounts at any time.
- 9. Student trustees are not eligible for the honorarium outlined in this policy.
- 10. Inspired by our Gospel values and imbued with the spirit of stewardship, Board members shall be encouraged to share a percentage of their honoraria with a charity of their choice that reflects Catholic values.

Glossary of Key Policy Terms:

SALEP- a program where for the student is released from regular, full-time school attendance so that the student can participate in an alternative learning experience that is considered suitable for him or her by a committee established in accordance with the regulation governing the Supervised Alternative Learning for Excused Pupils program.

SEAC-The Special Education Advisory Committee of each board:

- makes recommendations to the board with respect to any matter affecting the establishment, development, and delivery of special education programs and services for exceptional pupils of the board;
- participates in the board's annual review of its special education plan;
- participates in the board's annual budget process as it relates to special education;
- reviews the financial statements of the board as they relate to special education;
- provides information to parents, as requested.
