Our Thanksgiving Food drive was a great success. Students contributed and participated in the drive by



SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLANNING

One area of focus for improvement at St. Paul's is in the area of

Mathematics. You can help by remaining positive with your comments about Math, and helping your child learn basic math skills.

In the primary grades, you can help your child learn to add and subtract numbers to 18 mentally. Once they can do this, (9 + 9 = 18 is the largest fact they need to know mentally), all the rest is simply lining up numbers and learning about place value!

If children have these basic facts solidly in their repertoire, they can easily move on to multiplication and division – which are just adding and subtracting in groups. Knowing the multiplication tables to 12 X 12, makes computation of various problems much simpler as students move to the Junior and Intermediate levels. You can play games with these, making it a fun family time.



SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

Our students put on a great performance in X-country running at both Opishing and Gillies Lake. Volleyball has begun for the Gr. 5/6

students. They are practicing for some competition with other schools within our Board.



Below is an excerpt from *Health Works*, called, "Let's Work Together to End Bullying." This edition is posted on the bulletin board in the entrance should you wish to read it in its entirety. Three nonviolent strategies for kids to use to deal with bullying are:

Speak up. Let the bully know that their behaviour is not appropriate.

Walk away from the situation. Try not to show any emotion or to engage the bullying, this is giving them the response they are looking for.

Report it. Tell an adult -- for example, a teacher, a coach, or a parent -- then action can be taken to address the bullying.
