Important Information

Student Information Update Forms

These forms update pupil information at our office as well as in the Board. They are important for the proper care and safety of pupils when ill or if an emergency occurs. Please complete these forms as soon as possible. It is very important that any changes throughout the school year are communicated to the school.

SHCS School Code of Conduct

The School of Code of Conduct has been designed to ensure the right of every student to an education in a welcoming safe environment, without disruption. This code has been included in our student agendas which each student will receive. Please take the time to review this code with your child and return the acknowledgment slip to the school.

School Year Calendar

The calendar is designed for your reference throughout the year regarding a number of school-related activities, Professional Activity Days and school holidays. This calendar has been included in our student agendas which each student will receive and is also available on our board website. Sacred Heart Catholic School monthly calendars will be sent home and will be available electronically on our Facebook page.

Family Studies/ Technological Studies

SHCS is unique with regard to offering Family Studies and Technological Studies programs to our grade 7 and 8 students. At the beginning of the school year, these students are introduced to general rules and procedures of safe work for students. Students and Parents are required to sign an agreement to abide by these rules and procedures.

School Procedures

1. Attendance

In accordance with the "Safe Arrival" policy, when a student is absent from school their home will be contacted as soon as possible after 9:00 am and 1:00 pm. Parents are requested to contact the school before 9:00 am if their child will be absent/late that day to avoid receiving a phone call at home. When we are unable to make contact with a parent to confirm a legitimate absence that student will be marked truant for that day. Please ensure all home and contact phone numbers are current.

2. School Day

Yard supervision will begin at 8:30 am. In the interest of pupil safety, we require all students to come directly onto the school grounds upon arrival at school – either by walking or by bus.

3. Noon Hour Procedure

This year students will be eating in the gym beginning at 11:30 am. Outdoor recess, as well as various intramural activities, will follow at 11:50 am. All students who eat lunch at school must remain on the school property between 11:30 to 12:30 pm unless written permission is provided. Students who have written permission to leave school property will sign out and leave the building via the front doors at 11:30 am. If students are leaving the school for lunch they should NOT return to school until the rest of the student body is outside at noon. We thank you for your attention to this matter.

<u>Please note:</u> the office is closed from 12:00 pm to 1:00 pm daily. School doors are locked and not monitored at this time so should you need to pick up your child for an appointment please make arrangements with the office prior to 11:30. Thank you.

4. Leaving the School Grounds

A note or phone call from a parent/guardian is required for students to leave the grounds during the school day for appointments such as going to the dentist. Students will report to the office before leaving and sign out and sign back in on their return.

5. Picking up Students

Many parents pick their children up at school at 3:15 pm. Parents are respectfully requested to meet their children at the Duncan Avenue gate location. This allows all teachers to undertake consistent dismissal routines with their students. If it is important to have your child released before regular dismissal, please check with the Secretary or Principal. If a student is to leave the school with somebody other than his/her own parent, the school needs to be contacted by the child's parents; otherwise, the child will not be permitted to leave the school.

<u>Please note:</u> it is greatly appreciated by the office if parents and guardians would **contact** the office in the morning if regular bus students will not be taking the bus home or are to walk somewhere else other than to their home. The afternoons are quite busy in the office, and messages can and may sometimes be lost in the shuffle.

6. Bicycles and Scooters

Students are encouraged to ride their bicycles and scooters to school wearing appropriate protective equipment. It is also expected that students will ride their bicycles and scooters on the street and sidewalk, walk them onto school property and "park" them at the appropriate bicycle stand. Students must follow bicycle safety rules.

7. Fire <u>Drills/Lock Down Drills</u>

By law, the school must practice a fire drill at least 6 times a year. The fire department also conducts an inspection. As these drills are spontaneous, students must be wearing shoes at all times.

By law, the school must also practice lock down procedures at least twice a year. The staff at SHCS have been trained on proper procedure and protocols if there is an intruder within the school. These procedures are also reviewed with students to ensure that all students are aware of what they need to do in a lockdown situation.

8. Lunch/Snacks

Following the Food and Nutrition guidelines set out by the Ministry of Education, we

anticipate having a weekly pizza lunch and monthly special lunches. Further information

will follow. Please note: to ensure that students are able to eat their lunch in a timely

manner, we ask that student lunches require no more than 1 minute to warm in the

allocated microwaves. Please read the cooking instructions on all labels before

purchasing!

*We are a nut controlled environment! Please do not send snacks/lunch to school that

contain nut products. We have students with severe, life threatening food allergies to

peanuts and nuts.

9. School Supplies

SHCS provides the following supplies for your child: pencils, rulers, paper, notebooks, and

erasers. Some teachers will have specific requests that will be communicated to you through a welcoming letter. It is expected that all school materials such as text books will

be kept clear of graffiti and doodling. Damaged or marked materials will be cleaned up

and/or replaced by the student. Lost items must also be replaced by the student.

10. Oral Medication

Medication for students should be administered at home whenever possible. School

personnel dispense medication only when the appropriate documentation has been completed by a medical practitioner. Please contact our school secretary, Mrs. Guertin,

for the appropriate forms for the dispensing of medication.

Visitors to Sacred Heart Catholic School

For the safety of the pupils and to avoid disruptions in the classrooms, we ask that all people visiting or volunteering in the school report to the office first, sign in and receive a visitor's pass.

Volunteers

SHCS has been blessed with many excellent school volunteers. Volunteers have been involved in supervising trips, spirit days, pizza lunch, grade 8 trip fundraising, Book Fairs, Catholic Education Week, Catholic School Council etc. Should you wish to volunteer, please contact the school.

Catholic School Council

Annually, there are parents chosen/elected to the Catholic School Council. If you wish to be a candidate, further information will follow in September.

Extra-Curricular Activities and School Field Trips

Throughout the school year, there are numerous extra-curricular programs provided for the students. All pupils are encouraged to become involved in an activity of their choice. Students meeting the following criteria will continue to be invited to participate in school excursions and extra-curricular activities:

- 1. Good behavior
- 2. Good record of attendance and punctuality
- 3. Homework and assignments regularly completed
- 4. No serious disciplinary concerns

Extra-curricular activities and Field Trips are a **privilege** and not a right. Students who do not meet these criteria may put their participation at risk.

Electronic Equipment

Students are requested to refrain from bringing electronic equipment of any kind, including cell phones to school. If cell phones come to school they are to remain in the student's locker. If a staff member is made aware that a student has electronic equipment on them, the equipment will be confiscated and remain at the office until the end of the day. If this happens consistently the equipment will remain at the office until a parent can be notified to pick up the item. It is expected that parents communicate daily plans with their child at home and not rely on texting during school hours or leaving messages for them on the school phone. The school phone is available for emergency purposes or unplanned events.

Adverse Road and Weather Condition

Please listen to CJKL radio, 101.5 on your radio or check out www.ncdsb.on.ca to determine prior to the school day if the school buses are cancelled. You may also check our Facebook page. If school buses are cancelled, all regular classes for the students are cancelled. The school will remain open, but some staff may not be in attendance due to road conditions. Parents sending children to school must provide transportation to and from school. Please note that special lunches (e.g. pizza) are also cancelled on inclement weather days.
