# Message from the Principal

Dear Parents & Guardians.

With October upon us, the cold winds let us know winter is on the way, and it is easy to understand why this is the season for being thankful for all the blessings that we have. In line with this being the month of Thanksgiving, our Virtue is that of Gratitude. Students will be exploring what it means to be truly thankful for all the blessings God has given us, and this theme will be celebrated in our monthly Mass.

This October is additionally special as it marks the first canonization of an Aboriginal person, Saint Kateri Tekakwitha (1658-1680). She was beatified by Blessed Pope John Paul II in 1980 and canonized by Pope Benedict XVI at Saint Peter's Basilica this month on October 21<sup>st</sup>. Various Miracles and supernatural events are attributed to her intercession, and it is with great pride she is welcomed as a Saint. Her image can be seen in a beautiful stain glass representation in our own Christ the King Church here in Moosonee.

I would like to remind everyone of some upcoming important dates and events. ## All Saints' Day—Thursday, November 1, 2012


On the solemnity of All Saints, we celebrate all the saints, living in the fullness of life in Christ. The Gospel tells us how to become saints.
