This month's virtue of the month is Temperance (Self-Control):

What is Temperance? Temperance is one of the four cardinal virtues. St. Thomas Aquinas ranked temperance as the fourth of the cardinal virtues, because it serves prudence, justice and fortitude. The moderation of our desires is essential to acting rightly (prudence), giving each one their (justice), and standing strong in the face of adversity (fortitude). Temperance is the virtue which attempts to overcome the human condition that **"The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak" (Mark 14:38)**

Temperance is also defined as the righteous habit which makes a person govern their natural appetite for pleasures of the senses in accordance with the norm prescribed by reason. In one sense, temperance may be regarded as a characteristic of all the moral virtues; the moderation it enjoins is central to each of them. Thus it is the virtue that controls the yearning for pleasures and delights which most powerfully attract the human heart.

This month, students at E.C.C.S. will focus on temperance/self control and will be given opportunities to reflect on whether or not there is a need for a little more "**moderation**" in their lives!
