HELPING THE ENVIRONMENT

On April 22nd, which is also Earth Day, Sacred Heart School will be

Lights Out Canada was an idea created by grade 10 Canadian student Keleigh Annau after attending an environmental conference. She felt that schools could do small things to make a big difference and last year 122 000 students across Canada participated. MATH, MATH, MATH

Math has definitely been one of our main focus areas during this school year. The Ontario curriculum often

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expects our students to learn math in a different way than how most of us learned math. It is important to understand that there is a great emphasis on students being able to express their "thinking" in math. This means that your child is expected to be able to answer the question and fully explain how they got that answer. This explanation may take several forms.

We want to make sure you know that students are taught basic math facts during math class and are expected to know them. It is very important that your child master the basic math skills taught and we realize that most students often need more practice in mastering these skills.

We are noticing that students often lack the perseverance to work through a problem, especially when they do not know their basic facts, and it takes them longer to calculate a proper answer OR their lack of knowledge hinders their ability to look at their answer and determine if it is reasonable.

This is why we need to ask for your support. Ensuring your child has a sound knowledge of the facts appropriate to their grade is key to their success. For example, depending on your child's grade, can your child easily identify numbers and their values? Can they skip count by twos, threes, fours, fives, tens, starting at an odd number? Do they know what numbers add to ten without using counters? Can they identify the number on a dice without counting? Do they know how many days in a week? month? year? Do they know how many grams in a kilogram? meters in a kilometer? Do they know their multiplication tables? These are examples of concepts that have been taught in class but has your child mastered them? Programs such as ixl.com for the grade 3-6 students will help them practice what they are learning in class. The Ministry of Education has a website guide that offers suggestions to help your child. FULL-DAY KINDERGARTEN

In September 2013, Sacred Heart School will be implementing the Full-Day

Kindergarten program. Even though we have had our Junior and Senior Kindergarten students coming to school for the full day for many years now, this program, instituted by the Ministry of Education, requires some changes to how the 'traditional' Kindergarten program is run. As of September the "junior" and "senior" kindergarten students will be placed in the same class. We will no longer have separated Junior and Senior Kindergarten programs. You will also

see that there will be a teacher and an early childhood educator in the classroom working together to plan a program that is challenging yet geared to the child's level of development. The focus of the programming will be to design learning experiences that allow the children to explore and discover in a more play-based learning environment. Parents of our current junior kindergarten students will be receiving a pamphlet today that discusses the elements of the new program.

ENTRANCE AND DISMISSAL PROCEDURES



This is a reminder that the bell for entrance into school is 8:50 a.m. and our dismissal time is 3:20 p.m.

We have a growing number of students who are consistently arriving late to school. When a child is late for school their entrance to class disrupts the learning of others. They may also miss valuable instruction as Language and Math are usually taught first thing in the morning. Even if they are only 'a few minutes late', there is still a disruption as they need to prepare themselves for class while everyone is ready to start their day. Should you want to pick up your child after school, you are reminded to meet the teacher on duty who stands by the north entrance, check off your child from the pick-up list and then leave with your child. You will also need to be available to pick up your child at 3:20 p.m.
