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SCENT SENSE

Although the heat we have been experiencing is a welcome change to our cold winters, it has brought with it a different problem. That is, there has been an overuse of certain body sprays and/or deodorants (Axe for boys, various sprays for girls). We realize that proper hygiene is important, particularly following Physical Education and DPA, however, might we suggest first, that deodorant be used prior to school/the physical activity, and that any sprays being used, be of the non-scented variety. We have several staff and some students who have allergies to strong scents and many who are asthmatic. With the high humidity and the added difficulty in breathing with strong scents in the air, we are requesting that our students do not bring scented deodorants, sprays, perfumes, etc. to school. Just as we would not bring peanuts into the classroom of an allergic student, we need to respect the environment of those with respiratory difficulties.
