Student Safety/Snow and Ice



Now that winter has arrived and the snow and ice are plentiful on the ground, we would all like to play in it and with it! However, as much fun as it is, snow and ice can be very dangerous! In fact, most student injuries happen during the winter

months. In order for our school to be as **safe** as possible, the school rule must be that the snow stays on the ground – no snowball throwing, kicking snow or any other activity with snow or ice that could be harmful. Students must also be extra careful about **not pushing or shoving** as the ground is frozen! Please remind your child about this at home.

Dressing for Cold Weather

A reminder to all parents that students should come to school prepared to play outside in snowy and cold weather. A hat, mitts, snow pants and boots are required for all students who wish to play in the snow. Should the temperature fall below -25° with the wind chill, students will remain inside for an indoor recess.
