School Updates

Transportation: If your child receives a bus, it is important that they take the bus to and from school each and every day. If you have to pick up your child, please ensure that they are aware of this prior to them getting on the bus in the morning and then contact the school with this information. Please do not send toys to school with your child. There has been increase number of issues as a result of students trading or losing them. Your continued support on this will be appreciated.

Our Grade six students will be traveling to Camp Miniyowe from June 13th to the 15th. A brochure with a tentative schedule and meal plan will be provided to your child shortly.

Registrations for our Full Day Junior/Senior Kindergarten are ongoing. If you have a child that is eligible for JK (must be 4 years old by December 31, 2015), please come by the office to pick up a registration package.

Grade 6 orientation day and parent night will take place on April 27th at O'Gorman Intermediate School. The student session will take place throughout the day and the parent information session will take place in the evening beginning at 6:30 pm.

Building Understanding – EQAO is around the corner.

The primary division assessment tests the reading, writing and mathematics skills students are expected to have learned by the end of Grade 3. The junior division assessment tests the reading, writing and mathematics skills students are expected to have learned by the end of Grade 6. Both assessments are based on the *Ontario Curriculum*. The dates for these assessments will take place from May 25 to June 8th. Students are expected to be at school on these dates. Please plan trips, etc. outside of these times.
