And all other blessings.


As we partake of this food,

### Staffing - School Re-Organization

Our Board has been in the process of meeting compliance with the Ministry initiative of capping classes in the primary grades at 20 students, with only 10 percent of classes across the board eligible to exceed the cap. At St. Jerome School, we experienced small reorganization as a result of shifts in our population and one teacher, Ms. Spadetto-Forward's maternity leave. This resulted in a split class to ensure compliance with the cap and to ensure balanced classes. As part of our reorganization, we now have a JK/K Immersion class and welcome Mr. Marc Lauzon to our community.

# Pediculosis (Head Lice)

From time to time, there may be cases of pediculosis or head lice in our school. This should not be a cause for alarm. Lice are a nuisance, but are not hazardous to your child's health, as they do not carry disease. One of the most important steps to both their prevention and treatment is knowledge. Head lice do not fly or jump. They can only hitch rides from one head to another, and they prefer clean scalp and hair. By the time that the nits empty egg sacs are noticed on the head of one child in a class or family, it is likely that other children also have head lice. If a child has pediculosis, we will ask the parents to come to school and pick up the child. We will recommend specific shampoos to get rid of the live lice, and for appearances sake you may want to remove the nits with a fine toothed comb. Please take time to verify your child as there have already been a few cases reported.
