SCHOOL SUPERVISION

Please be aware that our school is NOT supervised until 8:30 am. If your child walks or bikes to school, be sure not to send him/her too early. Also, there is NO supervision of the school yard after school which ends at 3:15, and thus, students are expected to go directly home and not loiter in the yard.

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LUNCH PROCEDURES

ΑII students will eat from 11:40-12:00 p.m. and then get ready/go outside until 12:35. Afternoon classes will begin at 12:40. Please remember that eating lunch at school is a privilege that can, and will, be removed if necessary. Please note that students who go home for lunch are expected to leave promptly at 11:40 and should return by 12:35 to line up at **the bell.** Those students who go home for lunch are required to bring a note for the entire year so we have knowledge of their whereabouts and can hence ensure their safety.

SECRETARIAL HOURS

The school secretary is generally available during the following times:

8:00 a.m. - 11:40 a.m. 12:40 p.m. - 4:00 p.m.

Please be aware that we do not answer the phone during announcements at 8:45 am – 9:00 am. We have an automated telephone system that will allow you to leave a message regarding attendance or bussing without needing to speak to someone personally. Just follow the directions when you get the auto-attendant.

Thanks to many parents who do call each time their child is away. This saves a great deal of time and unnecessary interruptions. This system of communication helps us to ensure the safety of your child(ren).

AGENDAS

Agendas have been provided for students from grades 1-8 to help them to organize their time, homework and to help parents be informed and involved in their children's education. Please ensure they are signed and returned to school daily as your_partnership enables us to help your child be successful.



ELECTRONICS

Please be reminded that cell phones and all electronics (Ipods, MP3 players, etc.) are not allowed at school. If

there are impending emergencies, all children are accessible through the school telephones. It is disruptive to the learning environment when children are using cell phones to text, hiding them in their clothing and/or insisting they have permission to use them. It is in our school code of conduct that these devices are prohibited. They will be confiscated if children insist on bringing them to school and parents will be requested to pick them up.

ATTENDANCE

Regular and punctual attendance is directly related to success in school. All of our classrooms have Mathematics and/or Language classes scheduled first thing in the morning – so it is important to ensure your children arrive to school on time. Absent students should be reported by 8:45 a.m.
