<u>September 8-15:</u> We invite you to consider nominating yourself as a parent candidate and submit the nomination form to the Principal.

Should we receive less than 8 nominations and candidates fulfill the requirements outlined in the regulations, they will be acclaimed and informed of the first meeting date. **September 16**: School Council elections will take place if needed. Names of candidates and a one page information page, if available, will be made available.

<u>September 22:</u> The names of the Catholic School Council members will be announced in the communication folder.

September 23: This will be our first School Council Meeting. Please support your council by attending the regular meetings. Meeting dates will be posted in the St. Pat's Pulse. Meetings will begin at 6:00 p.m. and adjourn no later than 7:15 p.m. During the year, all meeting agendas will be set in advance—agenda items need to be forwarded to the Council Chair at least one week prior to meeting day. Food and Peanut Allergies

We ask that you join the St. Pat's staff in taking care to ensure the safety of all students in the school. As you may be aware a number of our students have a potentially life-threatening allergy. We ask your cooperation by not sending to • school with your child any snacks or lunches containing peanuts, nuts and shellfish. Other allergens will be dealt with on an as needed basis. The following guidelines must be strictly adhered to by all

the students in the school:

- All foods must be eaten in the classroom – not outside or on the bus.
- Snacks are not to be shared with other students.
- Utensils are not to be shared with other students.
- Hands are to be washed after eating anything that may have come into contact with peanut/nut products. Traces of peanut butter or oil can get on the bus seats or playground equipment, desks, and personal belongings.

Parents are asked to read labels carefully for the following products that may contain nut products: granola bars, crackers, chocolate bars and cookies, some cereals, store baked goods or snacks.

While we realize that this request may pose somewhat of a challenge for you when packing your child's snack and lunch, we wish to express sincere
