



#### Attendance and Punctuality

#### Tips for Family-Teacher Conferences

Family-Teacher Conferences are opportunities for parents, students and teachers to talk together about how to help each child succeed and be happy at school. Conferences are short (10-15 minutes) so it is best to prepare before the conference to make the best use of that short time.

#### **PREPARE**

Read your child's progress report. Make notes about your questions and concerns. Talk to your child about the report. Is she/he happy with her/his progress? Was she/he surprised by any comments on the report? Ask the child to predict what the teacher is going to tell you. Then, ask what she/he would like you to discuss with the teacher.

#### **ASK QUESTIONS**

Arrive on time. Bring your child's progress report and your list of questions with a notepad and pen to make notes. Family-Teacher conferences are strictly confidential, so you may share personal information that might be affecting your child's progress or behaviour at school (e.g. family illness, job search, new baby). This information will help the teacher understand your child better. The main function of the interview is to point out areas where your child has room to develop. Strive to keep the lines of
