





Beginning this year, all schools in the NCDSB district will offer **Student Led Conferences** in place of the traditional Parent Teacher Night. This will give students the opportunity to take ownership of their learning and have a more meaningful discussion with their parents regarding their strengths and next steps as a learner. opens up communication between the school, student and parent. It teaches students real life-skills such as communication. organization and leadership.
