Parking Lot Reminders

Our parking lot is a very busy place before school and after school. In order to keep our staff, students, visitors and community members safe, please remember the following things:

- Our driveway is one way, one at a time.
- Please enter the school parking lot from Mundy Ave and exit the parking lot onto Cedar Street.
- If you are dropping off your child (kiss and ride) please pull up to gate opening by Church.
- The buses will also be using the same drop off location—please be patience to keep everyone safe!
- Children who are walking or riding bikes, will need to use the crossing guard at the front of the school

School safety reminders and volunteers

Parents & Visitors must sign in:

Parents are welcomed to the school throughout the year, however, for the safety of our staff and students, parents and visitors must use only the front door for entry and need to sign in at the office. As part of our commitment to ensuring student safety, the doors remain locked during the school day; visitors need to be buzzed in with our buzzer system and report to the front office. Visitors are not entitled to go to the classrooms as this is a disruption to student

programming.

If you need to go to the classroom, arrangements can be made in advance with your child's classroom teacher. Parent messages and deliveries (keys, lunches, etc.) are handled through the office. Student lunches can be left on the shelf outside the front office. Don't forget to label your child's lunch.

At the end of the day (3:15) Students taking the bus will use the back door by the Church: students who walk or ride their bikes will use the doors by the gym. New this year: if you are picking up your child at the end of

the day, feel free to enter the school anytime after 3:00 to wait for your child in the lobby.

Volunteering @ St. Pat's If you are interested in volunteering at the school you are required to present the school administration with an original copy of a valid vulnerable sectors check (criminal record). An application can be picked-up at the office. If you provided us with a copy in the past, you are asked to sign an offence declaration form which can also be completed at the office. We appreciate your help and involvement!
