SAFE SCHOOLS - ANTI-BULLYING

We want all children to feel safe and secure at school. Part of our approach is to teach the children to "keep their hands and feet to themselves," as well as to use "kind and respectful" words. Another aspect is to educate them about the difference between a conflict and being bullied, and what to do in each case. While a single incident may still be serious, it does not constitute bullying. Bullying is something that happens repeatedly and over a period of time. Anything of that nature should be reported to staff to be dealt with accordingly.
