During certain times of the year we see an increase in the cases of head lice. This nuisance is problematic as it can impact your child's attendance. We cannot allow a student with live lice and nits to remain at school as they can cause the lice to spread to others.

All parents/guardians must be sure to routinely check their child's head for lice.

We will have to work together to make sure that the school remains lice free. Nits/eggs are usually off white in colour and stick to the lower hair shaft. They must be removed manually using a specialized comb or your fingers. A second treatment 7 to 10 days after an infestation is key to ensuring that lice will not hatch.
