# Message from the Principal

Dear Parents:

December and its snowy, blowy weather is upon us. The snow makes the landscape appear clean and fresh in spite of the harshness of the winds. This snowy wonder reminds me of how Christ has come to make me spiritually as white as the new fallen snow... Not that there has been anything I have done to deserve this gift of cleansing: it is God's gift, through His Son, for all mankind.

This Christmas season we welcome the babe born in Bethlehem over 2000 years ago. Jesus came in the most innocent and easy to love form I can imagine – a new born babe. Yet, His purpose for coming was to lead an exemplary life free from sin, then offer Himself for us on the cruel cross of Calvary.

When I think about how, in spite of my failures and sin, God gave His only Son the job of offering Himself to pay the price for my sins, I am overcome with both joy and grief. In this season where we give one another gifts of time spent together as well as physical gifts, I can't imagine giving my child as a ransom for lost sinners. Yet, God the Father did exactly that. As a mother, I can imagine giving up *my life* for *my children*, or even for the innocent children of others; but, I cannot imagine freely offering one of any child's lives in exchange for an undeserving sinner! No, not ever!

Yet... that is exactly what God did for when He sent His Son to take upon Himself my sin. "All of us were like sheep that were lost, each of us going his own way. But the LORD made the punishment fall on Him (Jesus), the punishment all

of us deserved." (Isaiah 53:6)

The Bible affirms in John 15:13: Greater love hath no man than this: that a man lay down his life for his friends. God the Father and Jesus, His Son, along with His Holy Spirit love all of us enough, in spite of our failures, to call us His friends!

As we celebrate the birth of Christ this holiday season with friends and families, let's remember the greatest gift of all: "For God so loved us that He *gave* His only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." (John 3:16)

May God richly bless you and your family as we reflect on the greatest gift of all this Christmas season: our Lord Jesus Christ.
