

Message from the Principal

Dear Parents & Guardians:

With the end of October upon us, we are well into the fall weather and winter is right around the corner. Seeing the snow on the ground is a real change from the weather down south after our hunt break, and I hope everyone had a restful break and successful hunting this past week. Communication Protocol

Dear Parents:

Once again we would like to bring to your attention that some children in our school have severe allergies to certain products such as peanuts, nuts, peanut oil or flour, peanut butter, eggs, latex and shellfish, which could trigger life threatening reactions also known as "Anaphylactic" reactions. The most common allergens are often hidden in food where you would least expect it. Food manufacturers sometimes use these products as fillers or substitute for taste.

Prevention, of course, is the best approach when dealing with ANAPHYLACTIC reactions to food. We ask for your cooperation in this effort by ensuring your child/children do not bring food containing any allergens mentioned above at school. Please speak with your child/children about the seriousness of this condition as well as the dangers of sharing food with other students.

If your pupil has a health problem of any kind, please inform the school staff immediately so the necessary precautions may be taken.
