## STEP2 Credit Assessment

Student records are evaluated to determine how many credits they have or need in grade 9 &10 or 11 & 12 Maximum of 16 credits may be granted in Grades 9 & 10 Maximum of 10 credits may be granted in Grades 11 & 12





Grade 9/10 PLAR Student Writes up to 4 Equivalency Assessments

May Earn a Maximum of 4 credits in each Assessment

Assessments are in English, Math, Science, and Canadian History / Geography Grade 11/12 PLAR

Student will need to:

Meet with Guidance Counsellor or Principal

Complete an application

Submit reasonable Evidence Portfolio based on past life experiences and training

**STEP 4** The assessor will communicate the outcome of step 3 with the student detailing credits granted and recommendations for the remaining credits to be earned.
