



PLAR (Prior Learning Assessment Recognition)

For Mature Students who are 18 years or older



STEP 1 **Pathway Planning** – Meeting with Guidance Counsellor or Principal

STEP 2 **Credit Assessment**
 Student records are evaluated to determine how many credits they have or need in grade 9 &10 or 11 & 12
 Maximum of 16 credits may be granted in Grades 9 & 10
 Maximum of 10 credits may be granted in Grades 11 & 12

<p><u>Grade 9/10 PLAR</u></p> <p>Student Writes up to 4 Equivalency Assessments</p> <p>May Earn a Maximum of 4 credits in each Assessment</p> <p>Assessments are in English, Math, Science, and Canadian History / Geography</p>	<p><u>Grade 11/12 PLAR</u></p> <p>Student will need to:</p> <p>Meet with Guidance Counsellor or Principal</p> <p>Complete an application</p> <p>Submit reasonable Evidence Portfolio based on past life experiences and training</p>
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STEP 4 The assessor will communicate the outcome of step 3 with the student detailing credits granted and recommendations for the remaining credits to be earned.
