

# **CATHOLIC EDUCATION WEEK 2005**

During the week of May 1 to May 6, the Northeastern Catholic District School Board will be celebrating Catholic Education Week.

Director of Education Paul Toffanello believes that yearly celebrations are in order as Catholic education is central to our students' academic and spiritual learning journey. "The foundational belief of Catholic Education is that spiritual and moral formation are critical to the formation of the whole person and to the realization of the fullness of life," explained Toffanello. "Catholic education always aims at forming students in the life-affirming Christian values that give life its true freedom, meaning and joy. In this way, Catholic education makes a distinctive difference not only to the lives of our students, but also to our communities, our province and our country."

Chair of the Board Colleen Landers sees Catholic Education Week as a community-wide event, which brings together all members of the triad, including family, school and

parish. "Catholic Education Week begins on a Sunday to highlight the partnership that remains the foundation of Catholic education," noted Landers. "We particularly want to underline the relationship of Catholic schools with the broader Church community, especially with the parishes that remain the centre of the worshipping faith community. Throughout Catholic Education Week, we hope that everyone in our school community will reflect on the significance of Catholic Education's presence in and contribution to our Church and our society. We also encourage all members of our community, especially parents, to participate in the prayer celebrations and activities that will mark the celebration of Catholic Education Week."

The planned schedule of events includes open houses and barbeques at several schools to welcome our stakeholders. Others will focus on the beauty of diversity, with presentations by various groups which will help them gain a greater understanding of the cultural heritage and pluralism of our community. Many students will showcase their God-given talent through recitals and art galas. In Kirkland Lake, new Junior Kindergarten students for September have been invited to a Literacy Tea with their parents. A trivia challenge on the history of Catholic Education in our communities will also be launched this week on the Board's web site.

One of the highlights of the week will be a Board-sponsored Writing Forum, which will feature northern Ontario author Glenda Lynn Sonier as keynote speaker. The winners of the 2005 NCDSB Writing Contest, as well as some additional randomly selected participants have been invited to this forum, which will take place at the new Timmins Public Library on May 4<sup>th</sup>. Students will take part in workshops and put their pencil to paper to explore their creative side. The winners of the contest which took place earlier this year will be announced during the awards ceremony at the end of the day.

The theme for the week is "Being the Body of Christ", a theme that is particularly appropriate in this "Year of the Eucharist". Through our intimate participation in the life of Christ as Christ's body, we "keep God present to humanity and to the world". This theme reminds us of the ultimate reality of an education rooted in Christ; namely, through the body of believers and the communion of the Eucharist, the divine is made "just as real and as radically physical as when Jesus of Nazareth, in the flesh, walked the dirt roads of Palestine."
