Gospel: Matthew 7:24-29

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

"Everyone then who hears these words of mine and acts on them will be like a wise man who built his house on rock. The rain fell, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on rock. And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not act on them will be like a foolish man who built his house on sand. The rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell and great was its fall!"

Now when Jesus had finished saying these things, the crowds were astounded at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority, and not as their scribes.

Questions for Personal Reflection



- How well are you hearing God's words and acting on them? Like the wise man or the foolish one?
- As Pope Francis appropriately pointed out, "We no longer engage in dialogue, but competing monologues." We may be good listeners, but are we truly hearing what is being said? How can we be more patient listeners; listening with both ears, being attentive and concentrating on the others' words rather than on our own responses?



Questions for Personal Reflection

- What can good listening look like? Good listening comes from a humble heart that sees others as more important than ourselves. ("Do nothing from selfish ambition or empty conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves." Philippians 2:3). Good listening focuses on the other first ("Let each of you look not to your own interests but to the interests of others." Philippians 2:4).
- Amidst the constant voices that compete for our attention, we must be mindful of the small voice within us who is God. This voice is what guides our words and actions. In what ways can we quiet our surroundings so that we can hear more clearly the Voice of truth who guides us on our way?



Amen. +






Guided Closing Prayer: Psalm 46:10
