

# Monthly Virtue: Love

The Importance of Love:



Faith, Hope and Love are the three theological virtues, and are the foundation of moral activity. Love is superior to all of these virtues. It also draws us closer to God and closer to one another. In order to better understand love, we need to reflect on God's love for man. We see God's love for us as being both selfless and sacrificial. The greatest

demonstration of these two attributes is evident in the passion of Christ. Before his death, Jesus informs us of his wishes: "My commandment is this: love one another, just as I love you" (John 15:13). Jesus loved His disciples and humanity to the end. Love motivates the Christian to do what is right in order to bring about the happiness of God and neighbor. Love is God's gift to us in Baptism. Our model of love is Jesus.

Looks like: serving others, lending a helping hand, sacramental engagement, opening a door for someone, allowing others to go before us, taking care of what belongs to others, helping others in need, praying for our loved ones and for our enemies.

**Sounds like**: prayer, encouraging someone, complimenting each other, listening to other people's ideas, treating people the way we would like to be treated.

**Feels like:** Welcoming others, helping others with their feelings, understanding each other, including others, feels like Jesus bringing a cool drink of water on a hot day.

Christmas Sharing Project - Once again this year, the staff and students of Pope Francis Elementary School will participate in a Christmas Sharing project to help client families of North Eastern Ontario Family and Child Services.

Each class is receiving a family profile and Christmas wish list. Classes are paired up to fulfill the wishes of a family. We ask that Pope Francis Elementary School families consider helping these families by providing items found on the wish list. Items donated must be new.

This is an excellent way for our students to live the virtue of Love. Through this project, they will learn that basic items they use every day are not always readily available to others their own age. It is our hope that through this project students will develop an appreciation for what they have. The wish list for your child's class will be sent home in a letter. Students may begin bringing items to school immediately. Bins will be provided for these items. December 4th will be the last day for items to be collected. Thank you for your support to this worthwhile project.

Treaties recognition week is from Nov. 3<sup>rd</sup> -9<sup>th</sup> – Treaty Week honours the importance of treaties and helps students and residents of Ontario learn more about treaty rights and relationships. Our students will be learning more about why treaties matter to all Ontarians.

Bullying Awareness and Prevention Week – November 17-23, 2019 – Ontario students, school staff and parents are encouraged to learn more about bullying and its effect on student learning and well-being. Bullying and harassment can have a serious and significant impact on learning, student safety and the school climate.

School climate is the sum of all personal relationships between all members of the school community. A positive climate exists when all members of the school community feel safe, comfortable and accepted. A positive school climate is essential for students to succeed in school.

Our students will be engaging in a school climate survey this month to help us with our School Improvement planning in this regard.

Student Led Conference - Progress notes go home on the 13<sup>th</sup> of this month. On November 21<sup>st</sup>, between 4-7 pm, we are hosting a student-led Portfolio night. You will have the opportunity to review your child's chosen work with them. Please join us!

### Student Attendance

The Education Act states that students must attend school regularly and be punctual. It is imperative for the safety of students that parents please call the school if your child is absent.

If a child has not arrived at school and a phone call or a note has not been received, the secretary will attempt to alert parents by telephone at home or at your place of employment, if necessary.

When a pupil returns to school, he/she should find out what work was missed and complete it within a reasonable amount of time, as decided by the teacher. Extended periods of absence for reasons other than health, require permission of the principal.

### Punctuality

All students are expected to be punctual and to adhere to the school hours. They should quickly be seated and ready for morning activities. Attendance is taken daily. Students who are late for a valid reason must bring a note. They are to report to the office where their time of arrival and reason for being late will be recorded at the office. They will be issued a late slip, which will be necessary for admission to class.
