The Importance of Faith:

The three theological virtues of Faith, Hope and Love are gifts from God that allow us to be in relationship with Him. We can compare these three virtues to glue—that attaches us to God. In our baptism, we receive the gift of Faith. Faith is our ability to believe with our minds and our hearts to trust.

The Education Quality and Accountability Office (E.Q.A.O.) has released the results of the provincial assessments administered to all grade 3 students in May of last year. The individual student results have been sent home to this year's grade 4 students.

Breakfast Program

General Information

Our school provides a nutritious breakfast for those who are in need to ensure that our students are well fed and ready to learn. Various independent studies have found that when students eat a nutritious breakfast, they perform better academically.

The Importance of Eating Breakfast

Food is fuel for learning. By starting each day with a nutritious breakfast, students are able to approach their school day with energy and enthusiasm. Although all students are encouraged to eat breakfast at home, we recognize that there may be circumstances that make this difficult. The Breakfast Club is in place to assist students in starting their day off right.

Our program is available to all students every day starting at 8:35 to 8:50 in the Breakfast room or Atrium. Foods provided meet the Ontario Ministry of Children and Youth Services (MCYS) Student Nutrition Guidelines and focus on fruit/vegetables, milk/milk alternatives and whole grains.

How is Our Program Funded

Funding for our program is provided by the Canadian Red Cross School Breakfast Program. As well, our school welcomes any parental contributions of money or food towards our school's own program. *Parental Contributions*

Our school's Breakfast Club is a safe and friendly place where children in need can eat a nutritious breakfast. The program is offered every day and is run by Mrs. Savard, Mrs. Maille and Mr. Berthier.

Most, but not all, of the funding for this program is provided to us by the School Breakfast Program. The Breakfast Club is always looking for donations. Money or grocery store gift cards are always appreciated and food donations will be graciously received as well. All of our food must be peanut/nut free. For more information on this program, please do not hesitate to contact Mr. Berthier.

Student Attendance

The Education Act states that students must attend school regularly and be punctual. It is imperative for the safety of students that parents please call the school if your child is absent. If a child has not arrived at school and a phone call or a note has not been received, the secretary will attempt to alert parents by telephone at home or at your place of employment, if necessary. When a pupil returns to school, he/she should find out what work was missed and complete it within a reasonable amount of time, as decided by the teacher. Extended periods of absence for reasons other than health, require permission of the principal.

Punctuality

All students are expected to be punctual and to adhere to the school hours. They should quickly be seated and ready for morning activities. Attendance is taken daily. Students who are late for a valid reason must bring a note. They are to report to the office where their time of arrival and reason for being late will be recorded at the office. They will be issued a late slip, which will be necessary for admission to class.

Persistent tardiness and absences may result in a discussion, consultation or other consequence perhaps involving parents/guardians, school board attendance counsellor, etc.
